She loved cataloguing her huge collection of articles about gardening, art and cooking. World religions and her Bible Study group were subjects of great interest to her. She researched genealogy for the family. She enjoyed spending time with children and was a nanny to one of her young nephews. Addicted to books, she made almost daily visits to the library and bookstore. She loved, and had a special talent for, interior decorating and made all of the holidays sparkle with decoration and celebration for her family. Although she quit smoking 19 years ago, her lung cancer was tobacco related. She wanted to have this fact in her obituary to warn people of the terrible dangers of tobacco use. She was preceded in death by her father Joseph Treble Sinclair, Jr. and her mother Miriam Hoener Sinclair. She is survived by a brother Joseph Treble Sinclair III (Lani), and two sisters Margaret Grace Robb (the late James M.) and Suzanne Elizabeth Williams (Mark N.) and nephews Stephen Sinclair Sullivan and John McCabe Williams and nieces Jennifer Sullivan Mills, Brook Jaclyn Sinclair and Amy Robb Scott.
